WHAT FUNDING IS AVAILABLE AND HOW DO COUNTIES PREPARE TO BE COMPETITIVE

How much funding is available?

 Federal outlays for grants to states and local governments have grown from \$16.4 billion in 1940 to \$734.9 billion in 2020

 In January 2022, there were approximately 2,073 federal assistance programs authorized by Congress


The IIJA (aka "The Infrastructure Package")


- \$1.2 billion in *total*funding available over

 - \$ \$650 billion in *authorized spending*





ARE YOU FROM A RURAL, SUBURBAN, OR URBAN COUNTY?





Q: Have you applied for state discretionary grants?


A: NO - 13% YES - 87%



Counties are more comfortable and familiar applying to state grants than federal grants.




LARGEST BARRIER OR OBSTACLE TO PURSUING FUNDING FOR PROJECTS

% OF RESPONSES





The Federal Budget and Appropriations Process



President's Budget Request

- Recommended funding levels for federal programs.
- •Generally released in February.



Appropriations Committees

- 12 Appropriations Subcommittees (in FY 2023, 10 subcommittees include Member priorities).
- Normally starts in the Spring.

House: "Community Project Funding" (CPF)





Senate: "Congressionally Directed Spending"

The Federal Appropriations Process

How Members of Congress Participate

Programmatic Requests

\$10 million to fund DOJ's COPS Hiring Program

Language Requests

Allow COPS Hiring funds to hire mental health co-responders

Earmarks

\$1 million for Monterey County to hire 7 officers

General Appropriations Committee Guidance

Request Limits

- House: In FY 2023, House Members were limited to 15 CPF requests per member
- Senate: No limit.

Public Transparency


 Members of Congress must post their earmark requests online and certify they have no financial interest in the requested project.

Eligible Recipients


- Public agencies
- Non-profits
- For-profit entities prohibited

Project Attributes to Consider

- **Demonstrate** local, regional, state benefit(s) of the project
- Project purpose and justification (i.e., why is this a good use of taxpayer dollars)
 - Think about Administration's priorities and priorities of your delegation
- Funding request, total project cost, cost breakdown (including all funding sources and non-federal match)
- Project timeline (start and end dates)
- **Project readiness** (environmental risk and permitting; technical feasibility and capacity; funding and financial readiness (obligating funds in a reasonable time))
 - If submitting more than one request, be prepared to rank.
